## LOCAL ELECTIONS

Many congratulations to Diane Andrews for her re-election as the New Forest District Councillor for Bramshaw, Copythorne North and Minstead.

Following an uncontested election on 7<sup>th</sup> May the Parish Council says farewell to Councillors Mark Bridle and Paul Glover with many thanks from the Community for all their considerable contributions in supporting the work of the Council over the last few years; and it welcomes new Councillors Georgie Hough and Dawne Wakelin. Following her election Georgie Hough says: *“Although I have lived in Minstead for just over five years, I grew up in Brockenhurst from the age of eleven and know the New Forest very well. I am a History teacher at a local secondary school and the practice manager for my husband's local equine veterinary business. ## ANNUAL PARISH ASSEMBLY

This year's Annual Parish Assembly was held in the Village Hall on Wednesday 18<sup>th</sup> March. Its purpose was to inform the community of the activities of the Parish Council over the preceding year, to outline the financial situation and receive reports from our County and District Councillors. An interesting part of the meeting was an introduction by our outgoing Community Beat Police Officer, PC Rob Morant about the new Hampshire Alert System which is mentioned below. Rob has since handed over his duties to PC Andy White.

### **HAMPSHIRE ALERT**

The local monthly Beat Report for our area has been replaced by Hampshire Alert which enables you to participate in the exchange of information with Hampshire Constabulary and Neighbourhood Watch. If you live or work in Hampshire or the Isle of Wight, you are invited to register now to become a recipient of messages of information, crime alerts and witness appeals local to the area in which you live or work in a way that suits your needs and lifestyle by email, text or telephone. To find out more ring 01962 875017 or just visit <https://www.hampshirealert.co.uk> and click on the REGISTER button at the top of this page to sign up. As a registered recipient you will not only benefit from two way messaging but may also hear about positive police action in your community, help identify suspected or wanted criminals or learn about community groups, events or meetings in your area. As a back up the Parish Council will continue to do its best to inform everyone of significant incidents in the locality as soon as possible.

Those who do not use the internet will be able to receive telephone messages about alerts which may affect them by asking someone to register their phone number on their behalf.

### **MINSTEAD SOCIAL CLUB**

Minstead Social Club was formed in the 1950's and is situated under the same roof as the Village Hall. The Club has a snooker room, main bar area and a committee room. Members can enjoy playing a game of snooker or pool, participate in bar games such as dominoes, darts or cribbage or simply enjoy a drink with friends. It serves quality local real ales and drinks are very competitively priced. The Club provides social events for members including the annual Treasure Hunt around the village followed by a BBQ, New Year's Eve Party and monthly musical entertainments. ### **ROADS**

Progress in repairing potholes and road edges has been disappointing and the Parish Council continues to press HCC for an improved response. It is possible to claim for damage to your vehicle caused by potholes or eroded edges. ### **REPLACEMENT OF DRAGONS TEETH**

You have probably noticed that the Forestry Commission has been replacing dragons' teeth in places round the Village. This is part of a programme of works under the New Forest Higher Level Stewardship Scheme to upgrade guttering and dragons' teeth to protect SSSI habitats and grazing resource from the damaging impacts of unauthorised vehicles access and parking along road verges. ### **FIREARMS SECURITY**

According to the police, on average 475 firearms are stolen each year in England and Wales. Although the level of theft is very low compared with the 1,800,000-plus legally held firearms and shotguns, one firearm in the wrong hands is one too many. Recently the

British Association for Shooting and Conservation (BASC) has been working with the National Crime Agency (NCA) and the police to draw up new advice on protecting firearms from theft. This advice is now published on the BASC website and covers storage and transportation of shotguns and firearms and how to keep vigilant when out and about. ### **LETTER BOX COLLECTION TIMES**

The letter boxes outside the Shop, on the Top Green and at Newtown show new collection times of 9am Mon-Fri and 7am Sat.

Despite this the actual collection times remain as they were i.e. 4.45pm Mon-Fri and between 9 and 10 am on Sat. Boxes by Football Green, at the top of Bull Lane and on the C17 still show the old times. We understand that the revised timetable will be implemented at some point in the future but Royal Mail cannot tell us when! If we find out we'll let you know!

## **A STRATEGIC CYCLING NETWORK**

In Autumn 2013 and supported by a local petition, Minstead Parish Council made proposals to the leading Authorities for a strategic cycling network to provide safe cycle routes between the main settlements in the New Forest. The main objective was to enable both residents and visitors to cycle safely without the hazards of busy roads. Over the following year this proposal gained considerable support from a range of organisations including other Parish Councils in the New Forest and as a result the National Park Authority has included it in its revised draft Management Plan for 2015-2020 with the following wording:

*Explore the funding and feasibility options, such as the M3 Local Enterprise Partnership, for adjacent to carriageway cycle routes between main settlements to improve safe access for commuting and leisure cycling, including a link between Lymington and Cadnam.*

*Lead organisations: Minstead Parish Council, National Park Authority, Hampshire County Council.*
