

# TOGETHER NEWS Sunday 12th July 2020

#### Welcome to our Seventeenth 'Together News'.

I've been in Pastoral ministry for long enough that suggesting that the church does something 'new' or 'different' has been as welcome as Christmas in the Turkey shed! But let me say this, not here in our Benefice! You have all been so supportive and trusting and I've welcomed that.

Before I say anything else, I invite you to take a moment to read the next verse <u>slowly and thoughtfully.</u>

'Forget the former things; do not dwell on the past. See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it? I am making a way in the wilderness and streams in the wasteland.' (Isaiah 43:18-19).

Over the past few weeks, along with other church leaders across the country, I have been reflecting on what church in the Benefice will look now that lockdown is easing. Now I know that I am never short of an idea(!) but this verse challenges me to stop! God says, *'See I am doing a new thing'*. The invitation is to all of us to pause and look long and hard enough until we catch a glimpse of what God the Father desires for us, His Children, what Jesus wants for us, his Church and where the Holy Spirit would have us go as his anointed. If God is doing a new thing, we should find out what it is and join in! There is no doubt about it, the ministry and mission of the Benefice going forward will not be the same. Much might remain unchanged but somethings we could do and perhaps should be different.

And so, I am inviting you to a Prayer Gathering I've called 'Streams'. We will gather from 9.30 - 10.30am every Saturday morning during August at David and Peggy Heron's home on the Beaulieu Road, Lyndhurst. Why? To seek God together, to discern in prayer and Bible reading together what \*New Thing' he is doing and ask for the passion to join in so that we would see 'Streams in the Wilderness'. This is an event exclusive to St Michael's but includes Christ Church and All Saints to. There will be worship, moments of silence and opportunity to find a quiet place to reflect.

I have been thinking about the following questions. You may have others, but I share these as a starting point for our reflections.

- \* Are there things we have started doing in lockdown that should continue?
- \* Are there new things that God is calling us to start?
- ♣ People are now familiar with connecting online how can we maximise this new way of meeting in all areas of church life?
- \* How can we allocate our financial and people resources to achieve this?
- \* What may be the enduring pastoral needs caused by lockdown economic, emotional, spiritual, medical that we will need to respond to?
- \* How can we share the gospel with people in this new context?
- \* Do I have gifts, resources, opportunities and interest that God could use?

I wonder if you sense with me that God just might be doing something new in us, with us and through us? If you do, then make a note of the date and time and join us. But before you do, have a look at Psalm 127 v1 and start listening and praying with us today before we meet together on Saturday 1st August at 9.30am.

We had about 25 folk at our Garden Praise last Sunday and the weather was amazing, just as it will be this Sunday afternoon when we gather at 4pm at Terry and Margaret's garden to sing our Hymns

of Glory, Songs of Praise. If you are coming, please bring your own chairs. Looking forward to seeing you. There is plenty of space to keep a safe and social distance. Discussions are underway about when we might gather in our parish churches for congregational worship, which is as you will appreciate, not as straightforward as we would think! In the meantime, **Garden Praise** will continue through to Sunday August 23<sup>rd</sup> in gardens in each Parish as we encourage folk to congregate together again safely for worship outside our church buildings.

I will be leading the Year 2 Leavers Service this coming Thursday morning at the school. Please pray for the children as they leave St Michael's for Bartley Juniors. An important but anxious time for them and their parents.

#### **Church Services**

Over the next couple of weeks, David and the Church Wardens will be discussing when we will be opening our churches for Sunday Worship. Our places of worship are just settling into a rhythm of prayer and we have introduced Garden Praise on Sunday afternoons as opportunities to gather safely. **Baptisms, Weddings and Funerals** are now permitted in our parish churches but with restrictions. Suzanne has been in regular contact with wedding couples, most of whom have rescheduled their ceremonies for either later this year or into 2021.
