Welcome to our Seventh 'Together News'.

It is heartening to receive emails, texts, comments on Facebook and letters (even from Italy) expressing thanks for the broadcasts and recordings we are producing each week for the Benefice and clearly a much wider audience! It is quite a challenge mastering technology and hoping that the upload speed on the internet will work in our favour (it can be VERY slow). Our passion at the beginning of this period of 'lock down was to 'keep faith alive and hope strong'. Our prayer for you, as you read this seventh (yes seventh!) 'Together News' is that you [we] feel <u>connected</u> to one another, <u>confident</u> that the mission of Jesus across the Benefice continues and most importantly of all, that you [we] remain close to God.

This week sees the introduction of a weekly Online discussion called '**IMAGINE**'. It is difficult to imagine what 'Church' will be like when we reach the end of 'lockdown', but I am convinced that we must try! We can be sure of this, that whilst it will be great to return to the pattern of worship, fellowship and witness across the Benefice, some things may not be the same.

THINK about it Joseph was in prison for two years Jonah was in the fish for three days, and Jesus was in the tomb for three days. On his release from his 'lockdown' in an Egyptian jail, Joseph became the countries Prime Minister. When Jonah landed on the shore of Ninevah, his preaching resulted in a spiritual revival and when Jesus walked out of the cemetery, the redemption of the world was made possible by his hard-fought defeat of the power of sin and the permanence of death.

Just this week, Dr Rowan Williams, the former archbishop of Canterbury, said that he is "not surprised by a reported growth in Bible reading during the current pandemic." He expresses his conviction that that the pandemic has triggered a "historic spiritual moment", noting that engagement with online church services is also booming, and that it is a response to feelings of disorientation, fragility and fear caused by the crisis.

Amazing and unexpected things can happen after a period of lockdown and just what the future worship and witness of our church in Lyndhurst, and Emery Down and Minstead will look like, we can only imagine! It really is worth thinking and praying about. So please drop in on the discussion this Thursday (and every Thursday during lock down) from 10.30 – 11.10am on ZOOM (see below for login details).

This week sees the STILL Prayer Meeting move on-line too. Join us as open our hearts to God in prayer for all that is on our hearts and minds at this time. You can join us on Tuesday at 9.30am on Zoom. (see programme of services in 'Together News' for details re. accessing IMAGINE & STILL online).

Some of you may have heard that our friend Peter Watson passed away last Sunday. We celebrate his life, his faith and the joy of the Lord, which was so evident in his life, even during the struggles of the past year.

NEW Diocese FREE Phone line

Available 24 hours a day on 0800 804 8044, the NEW phone line has been set up particularly with those unable to join online church services during the period of restrictions in mind. Callers will hear a special greeting from the Archbishop before being able to choose from a range of options, including hymns, prayers, reflections and advice on COVID-19.

Food Bank Update

The New Forest Basics Bank is working around the clock to make sure that they are able to support the hundreds of families that need help at the moment, especially in light of the recent situation. Since the beginning of March they have helped AT LEAST 1043 individuals, thanks to donations from members of the public and a HUGE effort from volunteers who are sorting through food, packing it up appropriately and delivering it to those in need.

Our nearest collection point is in Lyndhurst, in the High Street Co-op should you wish to make any donations. In the absence of Christ Church and All Saint's being open to accept donations, you can contact Reverend David who will arrange to collect any food donations from you.

Text to Donate

Last week we communicated the text to donation services available and following feedback, there have been a few amendments made to the services.

All Saint's - text the words AllSaints from your mobile phone to the number 70085 for a one-off donation of £5.00. If you wish to donate more or less than £5, substitute 5 with any amount between 1 and 20.

Christ Church - text the words **XChurch 3** from your mobile phone to the number **70085** for an instant donation of £3.00 and a monthly, reoccurring payment will be made of £3 to Christ Church. If you wish to donate more or less than £3, substitute 3 with any amount between 1 and 20. You can cancel the reoccurring payments at any time.

What do you do when you're not helping out at church?
When I am not involved in helping out at church I enjoy travelling abroad, looking after my 4 grandchildren who all live locally and

walking my Goldendoodle dog Molly in the forest. I am also a very keen genealogist and have researched my family tree back to the 17th Century. I have written a book about one of my ancestors who was a shipwrecked sailor on an East India Company Ship. I have been a regular worshipper at St Michael's since 1993, when we moved here from Berkshire. I know that there is a lot that goes on behind the scenes to run a church and felt that I had some skills to offer to help out. At my previous church in Iver Heath I had helped run the Sunday School.

What do you enjoy most about it?

The church building itself is magnificent but I enjoy being part of a diverse congregation and feeling part of the Lyndhurst worshipping community.

Is there anything you have enjoyed during Lockdown?

I have enjoyed baking home made bread, raising some seedlings from some old seed packets and reading more than usual. I have also enjoyed taking part in the weekly 'Clap for the NHS' and seeing all my neighbours in Wellands Road outside their homes joining in every Thursday.

What one thing would you like to see happen, in light of the changes from Lockdown? I would like to see a continuation of people making more effort to keep in touch with others, particularly the elderly and lonely people in the community. As one of the volunteers for the Lyndhurst Isolation Support Group I hear the deep gratitude of those people who phone up to ask for help with their shopping or collecting their prescriptions and wonder how they manage in normal times.
