Welcome to our Sixteenth 'Together News'.

During lockdown I read 'Scattered Servants' by Alan Scott who encourages 'ordinary believers (that's what we are!) to go beyond their Sunday services to bring life to their cities'. What Scott writes for cities is just as relevant to our context as a rural benefice. He suggests that to impact our communities, we must 'move beyond the building. It's time for a movement of people empowered by the Holy Spirit, sent to bring life to entire cities [villages]. It's time for scattered servants.' He suggests that our priority when we join a church should not be to 'support and save it, but to spill contagious hope into a hurting community.' I am very much aware of the amount of time, energy and resource we commit to 'maintaining church' when we should be reaching into a 'hurting community' where friendship and faith may be in short supply!

I hope you have picked up from our Sunday Bible readings from Pentecost that "If we don't go, we won't grow'. Our acts of generosity and kindness, even in giving just a cup of water to the thirsty as Luke reminded us last Sunday in his reflection, are to be performed 'out there' bringing hope to our communities beyond the walls of the church. It is my hope that we can share in a Benefice study of Scott's book this autumn. News of this to follow. Please email or text me if you would like to order the book and I will arrange a bulk order which will give us a 10% discount. The cost will therefore be about £9.00 per copy.

It has been really encouraging to hear that <u>parishioners and pilgrims</u> have visited St Michael's and Christ Church for prayer during the times we have been open. From today, (5th July) All Saints' in Minstead will be open for prayer from 9am – 11am every Sunday. Once again, we have taken measures to ensure that all who visit will be safe along with the volunteers who will be there to welcome you.

Please remember the Children, Staff and Governors of St Michael's Infant School in Lyndhurst as they continue to navigate their way through really difficult times. A Year 2 Leavers Service is planned for towards the end of term. The transition from Infants to Juniors is very important. Remember Mat (Executive Head) and Mary (Head of Learning) in your prayers as well as Netley Marsh and Copythorne Infants, (all part of the Oaks Federation). I am not taking Collective Worship at the school on Thursday mornings.

'GARDEN PRAISE'

This afternoon at 4pm (and every Sunday during July and August) we will be holding our **'Garden Praise'** Benefice outdoor services in the gardens of those who have offered to host. We can sing outdoors <u>but with strict compliance</u> <u>to social distancing etc</u>. Church Services

Over the next couple of weeks, David and the Church Wardens will be discussing when we will be opening our churches for Sunday Worship. Our places of worship are just settling into a rhythm of prayer and we have introduced Garden Praise on Sunday afternoons as opportunities to gather safely. In all this, we are moving forward towards gathering together as congregations towards the end of August. More details to follow.

Baptisms, Weddings and Funerals are now permitted in our parish churches but with restrictions. Suzanne has been in regular contact with wedding couples, most of whom have rescheduled their ceremonies for either later this year or into 2021.
