

TOGETHER NEWS Sunday 9th August 2020

Welcome to our Twenty-first 'Together News'.

I received a long-awaited hospital appointment this week, planted two rows of carrots, was introduced to vegan sausage rolls, had oat milk on my porridge and worked out how to make clerical shirts out of shirts with collars (I'll be wearing trial shirt on Sunday!). There's been a lot of changes for me this week!

Since lock down, the pattern of our lives has changed from what we used to call 'normal' and many have established new routines which have remained the same for so long now. Now that lockdown is being 'eased', we are able to re-introduce those things we have not been able to do and one of those things is gathering together for Worship – and, with many of you, I have really missed that. However, as with everything else, our gathering will be limited due to mandatory restrictions.

We will have to book either online or by phone if we are coming to Worship at All Saints, Christ Church or St Michael's. We will not be able to sing, although hymns and music will be played during each service. Social distancing will mean that there must be a 2m gap between individuals (those from the same household can sit together). Masks must be worn (unless you are unable to wear one due to medical reasons). No refreshments and no loos!

But we will Worship God as we listen to others singing, hear his Word read, offer our prayers and thanksgiving, confess our sins, listen to a reflection on the reading, declare our faith in the words of the Apostles Creed and take up an offering towards the mission of Jesus in the parish and wider world – and I for one, can't wait!

It will of course feel very strange but in our Worship we celebrate that we are not strangers either to God or to one another. We will be forced to sit far apart from each other, but in our Worship we express a closeness with each other as sisters and brothers in Christ which keeps faith alive and hope strong. Although we cannot sing, in our hearts we will echo the words we hear sung and rejoice. So, whilst I have experienced a number of new things this week (and enjoyed them all), Worshipping together with the most wonderful people who form our Worshipping community across the Benefice will be nothing other than an absolute delight!

There will of course be those who cannot Worship with us, who for a variety of reasons are still 'locked' into a patten of living that demands that they avoid any risk of infection. If this is you, then please know that we hold you dearly and pray for the Lord's peace in your heart and home in these worrying times. Not being physically with us does not mean that you are not spiritually part of us.

So, as we look forward to Sunday, let's pray for the renewing work of the Holy Spirit in our hearts and Worshipping communities. I remind you of what the Apostle Paul writes in 2 Timothy 1 v7 that 'the Holy Spirit, God's gift, does not want you to be afraid, but to be wise and strong, and to love them and enjoy being with them.' So I pray for 'HOLY SPIRIT ENJOYMENT IN THE HOUSE OF THE LORD' as we reflect on Psalm 122 in which David sings "I was glad when they said to me, let us go to the house of the Lord".

During August, we will be following a liturgy I have prepared and entitled "Welcome Home – A Liturgy for Gathering'. Please keep your order of service and take it home with you, remembering to bring it back the next time you come.

I look forward to seeing you 'at the gates of Jerusalem' as we gather to Worship the 'One True living God'

What a week it is going to be!

Online booking

Book via our website <u>www.newforestparishes.com</u> or on the phone for those without internet access - Kate, 07776 221663. Kate is responsible for taking bookings and would prefer those who are booking to go direct to our Parish website please, rather than call, as there are details requested to help us comply with the NHS Test and Trace.

In line with government guidance we are assisting the NHS with the Test and Trace service, by keeping an accurate temporary record of visitors to our Churches for 21 days (from the day of attending). You data will only be shared if requested by the NHS Test and Trace Service to help support the investigation of local outbreaks. If for any reason you are unable to attend a prebooked Service, you will be removed from the list. This is not compulsory but recommended as it really helps the NHS in the event of a case. You are invited to 'opt in/out' online.


We are taking measures in Church to ensure your safety;

- Hand sanitiser will be provided at the entrance and exit for everyone.
- Each household will be sat together and you will be shown to your seat.
- You will be socially distanced from others.
- From this Saturday, 8th August, wearing masks in Church is now mandatory unless you have a medical condition which prevents you wearing one or you are under the age of 11. Public Health England do not recommend face coverings for children under the age of 3, for health and safety reasons. A limited amount of reusable masks are available, for a donation, in St Michael's.

We have made booking as simple as possible and it won't take you longer than a few minutes. Booking will close at 6pm, the evening before the Service or once fully booked (if before).

We want to ensure that everyone gets to attend a Sunday Service so if you attend one week, preference when booking will be given to anyone who has been unable to get a place, for the following week.

If you wish to donate more or less than £3, substitute 3 with any amount between 1 and 20. You can cancel the reoccurring payments at any time.
