Safer Neighbourhoods team current priorities:

Our team priorities are set by our communities. We target the issues that you say are of concern to you and we work with colleagues and partner agencies to tackle local problems.

1. Tackling car crime in the forest car parks.
2. Reducing vehicle speed in the local villages and within the forest.

Total incidents reported: 78, 27 of which were crimes

The other reported incidents related to information messages, driving complaints and other non-crime matters.

Anti-social behaviour – (2) Fireworks were thrown from a moving vehicle at a pedestrian and a horse being ridden by a female in Winsor. Vehicle nuisance was also reported in Cadnam.

Assaults – (5) Four took place at local hospitals and one was domestic related.

Burglary – (2) There was one burglary at an address in Bramshaw and another in Bartley. *Please report any suspicious people you see day and night.*

Burglary (non dwelling) – (5) There were four commercial premise broken into and one residential garage in Cadnam. *Please ensure outbuildings are locked and secured.*

Criminal Damage – (6) A car was damaged in Cadnam and another in Bramshaw. A house window was damaged in Bramshaw and there were three incidents of small holdings suffering damage to fences and locks.

Road traffic collisions – (9) Seven involved animals; no persons were injured.

Road traffic incidents – Four people were summonsed to court for speeding offences.

Theft – (5) A male was charged with taking a vehicle without consent in Cadnam, gas canisters were stolen from a local store. A cement mixer was stolen from a driveway in Winsor, garden furniture was stolen in Cadnam and a paddock gate was taken in East Wellow.

Theft from vehicles – (3) Bags were stolen from vehicles parked in commercial car parks in Batley and Ower. Diesel was siphoned from a horse box in Copythorne. *Please ensure you secure your vehicle and remove all valuables.*

Other incidents – A number of suspicious vehicle and people have been reported in the last month. *Please continue to be vigilant and report these incidents.*

Speed watch – A total of 370 vehicles were checked by Speed watch volunteers in November. Of those 181 (48.9%) motorists were recorded exceeding the speed limit. Please get in touch with us if you would like further details regarding the recorded data and the action taken by police. Thank you to all involved in helping to make our villages safer. From January 1 this year to November 27 police have dealt with 2713 drivers for speeding offences in the Fordingbridge SNT area. Please contact us if you would like more details.
