March 2014: BT July 14 timeline committed...and offer for private funding to improve things rejected.

Today: Still 2Mb/s average speeds in Minstead


Action Taken by Residents

- Broadband Survey performed of Minstead residents (41 responses)
- Contacted Gigaclear
- Contacted Vodafone
- Private trials done (see Minstead website) of:
 - × BT Broadband vs
 - × Satellite Broadband vs
 - \times 4G vs
 - × 4G+ADSL

Minstead Broadband Today: Speed


- Minstead residents have an average Broadband speed of
 2.35 Mb/s vs national average of 17.8 Mb/s (Source: Ofcom April 2014)
 - \circ Minstead residents are therefore paying a very high £ per Mb/s
- Many residents achieve just 1 to 2 Mb/s as the average is weighted upwards by a few properties achieving 3 Mb/s+





Minstead Broadband Today: Location


- 3 Mb/s speeds mostly achieved north of the Trusty Servant
- Estimated 50%+ of residents are 1.5km or more from Cadnam 1 cabinet (by line length)



Minstead Broadband Today: Demand


 80% would pay for faster broadband

 78% use broadband for business / work

Minstead Broadband Today: 2Mb/s - So What?

- 120K people commute out of Hampshire (Source: HCC) Traffic could be reduced if Broadband speeds were superfast enabling:
 - Business to base themselves in the New Forest (providing local jobs)
 - Employees to work from home more frequently where commuting out of Hampshire
- Internet access improves communication in the community
- Properties with superfast broadband are more desirable impacting property values
- Those without usable broadband are disadvantaged in many ways in terms of
 - Entertainment e.g. iPlayer et al
 - Banking
 - Access to the best deals energy, insurance etc.

Observations

- There is huge demand for better Broadband in Minstead, and many are prepared to pay for it (see previous slide)
 - Most appreciate rural Broadband is hard and expensive but patience is now thin and confidence low
- HCC/BT lack of transparency (what, when and where) + missed commitments is anti-competitive
 - Residents inevitably 'wait and hope' vs considering other options like Gigaclear etc
 - o See "Rural Broadband needs competition, not cash"
- HCC's investment for Broadband for Minstead seems poor value for money as 50%+ of residents may not achieve superfast speeds due to cabinet distances
- The reality is had residents known what BT were planning and when it would be delivered we would/may have found a viable alternative to bring a better service, faster and to more people by now

Open Questions for HCC, BT et al

- When will Cadnam 1 be active?
- Given the low % of residents benefiting from Cadnam 1 will HCC consider alternative solutions to improve the situation e.g. subsidised 4G or otherwise?
- There is potential interest in a single capital contribution from some residents to accelerate the above what are the options and how much (BT et al)? e.g.
 - o additional cabinets in Minstead
 - o pole mounted DSLAMs
