Safer Neighbourhoods team current priorities:

Our team priorities are set by our communities. We target the issues that you say are of concern to you and we work with colleagues and partner agencies to tackle local problems.

Our current priorities are tackling crime and anti-social behaviour

Total incidents reported: 97, 22 of which were crimes

The other reported incidents related to information messages, suspicious incidents, driving complaints and other non-crime matters.

Anti-social behaviour – (11) Following 3 nuisance motorcycle reports on the open Forest 3 riders were warned. There were also noise and vehicle complaints.

Assaults – (15) Eleven occurred at a local hospital. There were four other assaults, one being domestic related.

Burglary – (0) With the lighter evenings be careful when leaving windows and doors open and please report any suspicious people you see.

Burglary (non dwelling) – (1) A shed was broken into in Bartley and a quantity of tools were stolen. *Please ensure outbuildings are locked and secured and contact local officers if you would like security and prevention advice.*

Public Order – (1) There was an incident in Cadnam where people were abusive to a homeowner who asked them to stop causing a nuisance outside their address.

Road traffic collisions – (9) Three occurred in the Fritham area; one involved a cyclist who suffered minor injuries. There were three incidents on the M27 and three on the A36.

Road traffic incidents – Eleven people were summonsed for speeding offences and two were arrested for driving under the influence of alcohol.

Theft – (4) Three involved thefts of agricultural equipment.

Theft from vehicles – (2) Two vehicles were broken into in a Forest car park. *Please ensure you secure your vehicle and remove all valuables.*

Other events -

Between 1st November 2013 and 30th June 2014 681 drivers have been dealt with for speeding offence on the beat. From today you can access up to date data. This can be found on the www.crimereports.co.uk website by searching under: Advanced Search > Proactive partnerships > local enforcement.

Speed watch – A total of 685 vehicles were checked by Speed watch volunteers in July. Of those, 422 (61.6%) motorists were recorded exceeding the speed limit.
