Safer Neighbourhoods team current priorities:

Our team priorities are set by our communities. We target the issues that you say are of concern to you and we work with colleagues and partner agencies to tackle local problems.

Our current priorities are tackling crime and anti-social behaviour

Total incidents reported: 91, 26 of which were crimes

The other reported incidents related to information messages, suspicious incidents, driving complaints and other non-crime matters.

Anti-social behaviour – (13) There were four complaints about nuisance vehicles, two noise complaints, four littering complaints, two complaints of rowdy behaviour and a neighbour dispute.

Assaults – (2) One occurred at a local hospital. The other dispute occurred at a school.

Burglary – (1) There was a burglary in Cadnam, a male has been charged and enquiries are ongoing.

Burglary (non dwelling) – (4) Two occurred at commercial premises and a garage and shed were broken into in Bartley and Winsor respectively.

Criminal Damage – (5) A window was smashed in Winsor; in separate incidents a security light and window were damaged in Stoney Cross. A bus shelter was damaged in Wellow and a caravan was damaged in Ower.

Road traffic collisions – (7) There were non-injury collisions in Bartley, Ower, the A36 and A31. A cow was hit in Bramshaw and one in Canterton; a pony was hit on the B3078.

Road traffic incidents – Five people were summonsed for speeding offences, two in Bramshaw and three in Cadnam. A vehicle was seized in Ower for having no insurance policy in force.

Theft – (6) Building materials were stolen in Winsor; electric fence batteries were stolen in Newbridge and also in Minstead. A gate was stolen in Bramshaw and there were two thefts at a local park.

Theft from vehicles – (1) Items were stolen from a vehicle parked at a garage in Cadnam. *Please ensure you secure your vehicle and remove all valuables.*

Speed watch — A total of 534 vehicles were checked by Speed watch volunteers in September. Of those, 258 (48.3%) motorists were recorded exceeding the speed limit.
