#### Safer Neighbourhoods team current priorities:

Our team priorities are set by our communities. We target the issues that you say are of concern to you and we work with colleagues and partner agencies to tackle local problems.

Our current priorities are tackling crime and anti-social behaviour

## Total incidents reported: 118, 25 of which were crimes

The other reported incidents related to information messages, suspicious incidents, driving complaints and other non-crime matters.

**Anti-social behaviour** – (3) There was a report of fireworks being thrown; a neighbour dispute in Bramshaw and nuisance vehicles in Minstead.

Assaults - (2) Both occurred at local care homes.

**Burglary** – (2) There have been breaks in Minstead and Fritham and enquiries are ongoing. *Please report any suspicious people or vehicles you see day and night.* 

**Burglary (non dwelling)** – (3) There were three breaks in Fritham on the same night and a further report in Winsor. *Please ensure outbuildings are locked and secured.* 

Criminal Damage – (2). Both occurred at local hospitals

**Drugs –** (2) Two males were found in possession of cannabis in Ower.

**Public Order** – (2) There were two incidents in Ower.

**Road traffic collisions** – (15) Eleven occurred on the M27/A31. Three involved animals, two on the B3078 and one on the B3079. There was also a collision on the A337 that resulted in minor injuries.

**Road traffic incidents** – 37 drivers were summonsed to court for speeding offences on the beat. A male was charged with driving on the A31.

**Theft** – (4) On two occasions batteries were stolen from temporary traffic lights in Winsor; items were taken from a garage forecourt and items were removed from a bag in a local park.

**Theft from vehicles** – (3) All occurred in residential areas. Please ensure you secure your vehicle and remove all valuables.

Speed watch — A total of 800 vehicles were checked by Speed watch volunteers in October/November. Of those, 470 (58.7%) motorists were recorded exceeding the speed limit.
