Safer Neighbourhoods team current priorities:

Our team priorities are set by our communities. We target the issues that you say are of concern to you and we work with colleagues and partner agencies to tackle local problems.

Our current priorities are tackling crime and anti-social behaviour

Total incidents reported: 76, 28 of which were crimes

The other reported incidents related to information messages, suspicious incidents, driving complaints and other non-crime matters.

Anti-social behaviour – (0)

Assaults – (3) A delivery driver was bitten by a dog in Winsor and two occurred at local care homes.

Burglary – (0) *Please report any suspicious people or vehicles you see day and night.*

Burglary (non dwelling) – (11) Nine occurred in the Winsor/Bartley area; one in Fritham and one at a local hotel. *Please be extra vigilant if you are bordered by fields or woods and ensure outbuildings are always locked and secured.*

Criminal Damage – (7) In Cadnam the paintwork and tyres of two cars were damaged; three vehicles had windows damaged and a garden gate was also damaged. There was damage caused at a local hospital.

Drugs – (0)

Public Order – (1) There was an incident in a car park.

Road traffic collisions – (12) Four involved animals, two on the B3079, one on the A31 and one in Minstead. There were also three collisions in Ower, one in Bramshaw, one in Cadnam, one in Fritham, one in Minstead and one in Winsor; none resulted in serious injuries.

Road traffic incidents – 14 drivers were summonsed to court for speeding offences on the beat, six in Cadnam, three in Bramshaw and five on the A31. A driver was also summonsed for using a mobile phone whilst driving in Ower.

Theft – (1) A vending machine was tampered with in Ower.

Theft from vehicles – (4) All occurred in Forest car parks. *Please ensure you secure your vehicle and remove all valuables.*
