Thought for the Week Understanding God's Word (and human revision)

In the Gospel reading today, Jesus cuts through to the heart of the crucial question, "How are we to understand what God is saying to us?"

The sub-text is, "and how can we tell when we humans are revising, subtracting from, adding to or conveniently ignoring God's Word to suit our own purposes, desires, fashions, culture or politics)

This is not simple, but nor is it impossible.

The first thing to remember is that God's Word to us is intended to give us a happy, fulfilled, eternity bound life. To use a phrase you'll often hear in episcopal circles, it's for our common good. God's not a cosmic spoilsport: he ordered the universe for us to enjoy looking after.

Second, we need to remember that God gave humans free will, so we're free, free to live in the flow of his created order, or free to try our own ideas out and see where they get us.

Third, Jesus based his life on the scriptures. He sometimes had to correct misunderstanding, and dig back down to the original meaning in their original context. Finding the original meaning in the original context is vital if we are to understand what God's word is saying.

Fourth, we need to apply the original understanding in the original context to our own situation wisely. As the Queen said last week, in such a fast-moving world we need to cultivate "staying calm and collected," and, to leave "room for quiet thinking and contemplation." It is simply foolish to adopt wholesale changes to our current practise based on a few years of frenzied media pressure.


