How should we 21st Century inhabitants of the wealthy West live our lives?

We have a clear but challenging choice:

EITHER 1: We live according to the (constantly shifting) demands, fashions, preferences, choices, tendencies, values of the present day.

OR 2: We build our lives on the eternal, unchanging firm foundations of God's word

The first is like walking on a beach, beautiful in the sunshine, but treacherous with invisible patches of shifting quicksand. You never know where the quicksand will appear, so life becomes exciting but provisional and potentially dangerous, but it is where we have chosen to walk.

The second follows the Psalmist in Psalm 130. 5-6 "I wait eagerly for the Lord's help and in His word I trust."

This way requires trust and patience. The Psalmist has maybe served as a sentry, protecting the camp or the city from invasion overnight in the darkness. You can imagine the scene, looking to the eastern horizon for the hints of the sun's return. Looking anxiously over your shoulder for any sign of incoming trouble.....If only the dawn would hurry up and relieve me of the threat hiding in the darkness.

"I wait for the Lord more eagerly then sentries wait for the dawn."

We could say with the Psalmist we wait for the Lord to be true to His word rather than give in to the powerful temptation to simply fall in to line with prevailling fashion. The sun will eventually come up, but it may be a long night.....
