Trusting God Brings Joy and Peace

'May the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace as you trust in him.'

Romans 13:15

Trusting God is so much simpler than not trusting Him. When you doubt God, His Word, and His promises, you're left to your own devices and reasoning when it comes to working things out. And as a result you get stressed out. Take a moment and read the following three verses, then think carefully about what they mean: 'But the message they heard was of no value to them, because those who heard did not combine it with faith. Now we who have believed enter that rest' (Hebrews 4:2-3 NIV 1984 Edition). 'He who has once entered [God's] rest ... has ceased from [the weariness and pain] of human labours' (Hebrews 4:10 AMP Classic Edition). 'Come to Me, all you who labour and are ... overburdened, and I will cause you to rest. [I will ease and relieve and refresh your souls]' (Matthew 11:28 AMP Classic Edition). How are you supposed to approach God? In faith! The Bible says: 'Without faith it is impossible to please and be satisfactory to Him. For whoever would come near to God must [necessarily] believe that ... He is the rewarder of those who earnestly and diligently seek Him [out]' (Hebrews 11:6 AMP Classic Edition). That means when you come to God, you must do the believing. And when you do, you'll receive His joy and peace. These two things are God's will for you; they were bought and paid for at the cross. Christ's work is already finished, and the only thing that remains to be accomplished is for you to believe. When you do that, God will respond and bless you every time!

Jane Austin Tour with Coffee and Cake: 3rd September



Jane Austen died in Winchester in 1817, in rented rooms in College Street. She was buried in the north aisle of the Cathedral. This tour offers visitors an intimate and often amusing insight into her life and connections with the

Cathedral. The tour will include a walk through the Cathedral's historic Inner Close to the house on College Street where Jane and Cassandra stayed during their time in Winchester.

Guided tours are available throughout the year to groups. Public tours will be taking place on the first Saturday of the month from February to November 2016.

WW1 Tour and Cream Tea: 26th August



Join a Cathedral guide and be taken on a tour which will look back at World War 1, particularly 1916 and how it relates to Winchester Cathedral. Followed by cream tea in the Cathedral Refectory.

'Remembering the Somme: from Hell to Eternity' - The tour, focusing on 1916, includes a visit to the Crypt to hear the story of the cross that came back from the Battle of the Somme, a lament sung by a Cathedral guide and a walk along the Nave roof to visit the bell ringing chamber.

Teresa Rogers from Redlynch has scooped the first prize in this year's New Forest Open Art Competition with her painting 'Autumn Trees'.

The competition was stiff this year with a record 219 entries, making a hard job for the judges to choose the shortlisted pieces which will be on display in the New Forest Centre Gallery until 3 September. The other prize winners were Malcolm Sears whose painting 'Hurst Point Lighthouse' was placed second and Baxter Bradford's photograph 'Magical Journey' which came third. Kim Weiler was also highly commended by the judges for her gorse wood sculpture 'The Forester'. 'This has been another record year for Open Art Competition entries and as usual the standard has been very high,' commented New Forest Centre Manager Hilary Marshall. 'The public will also get an opportunity to vote for their favourite New Forest inspired artwork as our People's Choice Competition runs until the end of the exhibition.'

The New Forest Open Art Competition is run in partnership by the New Forest National Park Authority and the New Forest Centre, with support from ExxonMobil at the Fawley Refinery.
