Thought for the Week

Jesus says something which is both astonishing and moving in today's reading from John: "I do not call you servants any longer... but I have called you friends." But something else he says might take us aback: "You are my friends if you do what I command you." Now we don't tend to think of friends as issuing rules, and we don't think of friendship as dependent upon keeping them. So let's think about the Red Arrows again for a moment. To get to that level of precision and skill takes years of training - and of course training requires obedience. So with such high stakes you can bet that fighter and aerobatic pilots take obedience extremely seriously – because they know their lives depend upon it. Of course we're fine, down here on terra firma. Since we don't have earth spinning towards us at hundreds of miles an hour, we don't have to obey commands in order to save our lives. Or do we?

Throughout the Gospels Jesus spells it out with stark warnings and parables – the slave who fails to use his talents, the wicked vineyard tenants, the unproductive fig tree – they all end up cast out of heaven because they disobeyed God's commandments. So in fact our eternal lives also depend upon obedience – the stakes could hardly be higher. And it would be a poor friend who didn't do anything in his power to save our lives – even if that meant laying down the law.
