7. Reports from County and/or District Councillor

8. Report from Lengthsman

- Footpath 5: grass strimmed, cut back areas of vegetation at path edge, cleaned off debris.
- Footpath 4: strimmed grass, cleaned off debris, leaving majority of pretty spring flowers.
- Cleaned inside of both bus shelters. Noted small amount of repairs needed to Hall bus shelter.

Resolution: To be resolved that the February meeting minutes be added to record that "the signed Minutes of February Meeting are amended to read Both County and District Councillors have granted funding (total £2,000) to Minstead Parish Council who may, at its discretion, use towards initial seed-funding the Minstead Village Community Shop Project. The parish council voted to fund £550 initially to cover costs of joining Plunkett and formation of CBS, but to retain the balance pending successful completion of those items."

Proposed by Chairman Cllr Andrews, seconded by Vice-Chairman Cllr Cattell.

Agreed unanimously.

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14. Minstead Community Fibre Broadband scheme

Chairman gave a brief resume of the current position: parish council is waiting for HCC to produce a contract which they had hoped to sign by end March. There will be 30 days to raise money - responses from community regarding contributions have been positive but if total is not raised then shortfall will have to depend on generosity of others. However, HCC has withdrawn crowd-funding mechanism so council will explore banking arrangements.

Chairman emphasised that the match-funding will close by 30 April.

Members of the public present offered to help with communication within the community.

15. Matters raised by Councillors

- Village Litter pick (6 April): meet at Village Green, 10.30. Volunteers should take collected litter home to put out for collection with their domestic refuse.
- Black tarmac: new surface dressing on New Road is black, not grey as is required within New Forest. Cllr Andrews has written to Cllr Heron to ask whether regulations have changed.
- Minstead Mail: next edition in May to introduce new council and provide updates on Broadband and Community Shop.
- Parked car: vehicle that is taxed and insured has been in Congleton Close car park for last two months. Cllr Bennett to report to PCSO Williams to see if he can help and to report also a car abandoned at Running Hill turning off A31.
- Chairman thanked councillors for their support during his term of office.
