<u>Burglaries:</u> So far this month NO homes have been burgled in the New Forest Heart area but there have been 6 break-ins to outbuildings in the area. These happened on Hill Street and at Paultons Cricket Club where a caravan was stolen at the same time. Garages in Lyndhurst, Bartley, Brook and Ashurst have also been targeted.

I'm sure you will know by now that we have made an arrest in connection with a number of sheep deaths in Cadnam and Bramshaw. A 41 year old man from Winchester was arrested on Friday 24<sup>th</sup> January and investigations are still being carried out. If you have information about these deaths then please call either 101 or use the online reporting section of the Hampshire Police website.

In other incidents a woman has been interviewed after the theft of spa products from a hotel on the outskirts of Lyndhurst, a window has been deliberately smashed at the Beaulieu Motor Museum and 5 people have been found in possession of cannabis, 2 in the car park at Lyndhurst, another 2 in Cadmans Pool car park and the other in Hawk Hill car park. The drugs have been seized and destroyed and community resolutions have been issued.

A bicycle was stolen from outside a pub in Brockenhurst and a driver of a van has been charged with drug driving after he was stopped during a joint operation we held with the enforcement team at New Forest District Council. We were stopping vehicles carrying waste and scrap metal to make sure they had the correct licences. He didn't have an MOT for his van, failed a roadside drug test and some cannabis was seized and destroyed from inside the van.

Theft From Motor Vehicle: 9 vehicles have been targeted this month. The first incident saw a £3,000 bicycle taken from the roof of a car parked in a pub car park in Lyndhurst, two cars had handbags stolen from them while they were parked outside the pub in Fritham and another two while they were in the Millyford Bridge and Pipers Wait car park. Vehicles parked on the roadside in Lyndhurst, Ashurst, Cadnam, Brockenhurst and Woodlands have also been broken into but nothing was stolen.

Finally we have had two reports of "fly tipping" this month, at Bolderwood and in Cadnam. If you do find rubbish that has been dumped anywhere then please report if to us and New Forest District Council. Their enforcement team is brilliant at finding those responsible and prosecuting them. If you see anyone actually dumping rubbish then let us know immediately. In February, March and April we will be working in partnership with New Forest District Council and holding special operations that mean we can stop any vehicles carrying rubbish and waste and make sure they have the correct licenses.
