  - ➤ She will ask PCSO Williams whether to ask whether Speedwatch data (postcodes) could be used to identify whether those speeding are local (SO43 residents) or outsiders.
- Website software has been updated. There are a few teething problems with using the new version.
- Recent NFALC meeting included:
  - NFDC proposals for Electoral Review of Ward Boundaries puts Minstead with Lyndhurst.
  - Safer New Forest presentation seeking cooperation from parish councils on safeguarding vulnerable people online.
- HCC Parish event: topics included: climate change; community energy; wind power potential; Greening Campaign; lack of money; HCC declared a climate emergency on 17/06/19.
- Quadrant Meeting: NPA initiative Volunteers needed for clearing paths. New Forest Spring Clean 20
  March 13 April 2020. Regulating Campsites need parishes to list campsites within their parish.
  Considerable changes likely in Waterside area. NFNPA declared a climate and nature emergency at the authority meeting on 23/01/20.

# **Decision Awaited**

**18/00954** Petrol Station, Ringwood Road. Single storey rear extension to sales building to provide sandwich bar.

19/00909 Hollyhock Cottage. Reconfiguration of domestic curtilage.

This application for reconfiguration was prompted by siting of a caravan outside domestic curtilage in contravention of planning regulations. Council discussed a similar situation at Grove House where a caravan had been moved in response to an Enforcement Order. It was pointed out that planning applications must be considered separately from Enforcement Orders.

# **New Planning Applications**

19/00911 Peters Hold. Replacement dwelling; detached garage/carport; associated works and landscaping (demolition of existing dwelling and annex). Comment No 4: we support Landscape Officer re spoil, lighting and size of basement; we are also in agreement with the Conservation Officer's report which was critical of the design and did not support the application.

**19/00932** The Cottage, Toms Lane Corner. First floor extensions; conversion of attached stables to facilitate additional accommodation; new pitched roof to existing attached garage; alterations to fenestration; raised patio; removal of existing porch. **Comment No 4 because increase is greater than 30%.** 

19/00949 The Cottage, Toms Lane Corner. Replacement outbuilding; new retaining wall to facilitate access alterations and new driveway; removal of existing outbuilding. Comment: Councillors have concerns about the oak tree (T1). However, they would support this application subject to the precautionary measures in the Arboricultural report which states no long-term damage to the tree.

**20/00043** Holly Lodge, Emery Down. Outbuilding; conservatory; porch; 2no roof lights, replacement gate, terrace extension (demolition of carport, outbuilding and conservatory). **Only extreme NE corner of this plot is in Minstead, the major part including the area for proposed development, being in Lyndhurst parish.** *No Parish Briefing yet so postpone discussion to next meeting.*

# 18. Matters raised by Councillors

- Leaning telegraph pole on Newtown Road is leaning further. Cllr Taylor has already contacted Openreach and will report again including the low-hanging cables at three locations.
- Agreed Minstead Spring Litter Pick w/b 23 March. Cllr Bennet to organise and Clerk to request equipment.
- Since reducing traffic in one place just results in it going elsewhere, Cllr Taylor is hoping to get *Traffic* recognised as a single issue, rather than as separate problems in specific locations.
- Broadband council will push for improvements to areas not included in existing schemes.
- Woodside corner yet another vehicle went off eroded edge and got stuck. This dangerous edge has been reported to Highways many times. Cllr Taylor to write to Cllr Heron appealing for help - possibly reflective posts and/or warning signs?
