## **MINSTEAD OIL**

In case you have not already read it this message from Mike Hutton is especially for those who traditionally ask for their tank to be filled up, with an estimate of the quantity required.

It has become obvious that the oil companies, in an attempt to compete on price, are now only delivering the estimated quantity and no more. This means the tankers get back to the depot as nearly empty as possible.

It has become so bad that the company contracted to deliver oil to Minstead Hall have allowed the tank to run dry, twice, this winter.

The warning to you is please make as accurate an estimate as possible of the quantity required to fill your tank. I hesitate to suggest over-estimating but it would be interesting to discover what happens!

Those who traditionally ask for their tank to be filled will find that their bill was exactly for the estimated quantity - no more. Mine has been like this on the last two occasions and fortunately my estimate was probably within 100 litres of that required to fill the tank each time.

## **MINSTEAD VILLAGE HALL CENTENARY**

At the onset of hostilities in 1914 various large temporary huts were erected at a site on the outskirts of Romsey to house and train the thousands of horses that were needed for the War effort, many were shipped in from Canada and North America, landed at Southampton and taken to this Remount facility. At the end of World War I the Government of the Day decided to sell off these now redundant buildings.

Dan Hanbury a local benefactor bought two of these huts probably at the instigation of his wife who was a staunch supporter of the then newly formed W.I. that was in need of a large venue for their meetings (well over 100 women from the village and surrounding area). In 1920 the newly positioned huts formed the main part of the building that you see today. Its purpose - for the benefit of the villagers and local area - and was known as The Minstead Hut, the largest community building then (as now) in the New Forest.

Over the Century it has had many uses and centre of so many local activities as it continues today - it even underwent a name change after the villagers had paid of the debt to buy the building in 1963 (don't know the history - read it in the Congelton Room} it is now known as The Minstead Hall. The fabric of the building is much improved and adapted to comply with modern tastes and needs. We learnt the building is sound following a recent Structure report, however we did not think that 100 years should go unnoticed and thought it would provide a good

opportunity to add value to the building for future generations. Over the next few years the cladding, especially on the south side (front) needs replacing. There are enough funds to do this but with extra we could re-clad using cedar which not only would look better it would also last much longer, but cost nearly twice as much. To this end we are putting on various activities and events to celebrate the Hall's centenary and raise funds for this project.
