# Report by Chairman (Cllr Bill Andrews)

#### Minstead Annual Parish Meeting - Financial Summar

- Audit of the governance of Minstead Parish Council and the accounts for financial year ending 31 March 2022 was successfully completed.
- Council has maintained the current precept request at £12,000 (no increase) for the coming year, 2023-24.
- Council finances remain in a sound position with a current balance in excess of £14,000 (excluding reserves). There have been no unusual costs beyond those relating to council administration and normal maintenance within the parish.
- In addition to the general reserve maintained by the council (£6,000), the council has established specific reserves for potential upcoming investment which may be required:
  - Cricket Pavilion (Repairs or replacement) £15,000
  - Audio Visual Equipment (Village Hall) £5,000
  - Note: These are held as a reserve only and not committed for payment
- Grants were received this year from:
  - HCC to support HCC Parish Lengthsman Scheme: £1,100 towards Lengthsman salary; this will continue into 2023-24.
- Parish Council has made grants and donations so far this year to:
  - ▶ Jubilee Celebrations, All Saints Church, Royal British Legion, Citizens Advice Bureau and potentially to Minstead Flower Show (under consideration)

Volunteer led community group set up by Minstead parishioners and councillors


Aim of helping and supporting each other in initiating "Green" based ideas in our community

#### **Home Insulation**





Our first initiative is to look at the insulation of the homes in our community.

Not only will this lower energy costs for home owners, but make a real difference in lowering our community's carbon footprint.

In a typical British home around one-third of heat produced from its heating system is lost unutilised. Minstead houses, being generally older stock, are likely losing more than this!

But how can we tell where our homes are losing heat and money is best spent?

Minstead Green Group are now able to offer free thermal imaging of houses within the parish, which is a great place to start!



This house has benefitted from loft and cavity wall insulation, but heat still sees the single skin door as open!
